Rule 8.204(d) provides that “[a] party filing a brief may attach copies of exhibits or other materials in the appellate record or copies of relevant local, state, or federal regulations or rules, out-of-state statutes, or other similar citable materials that are not readily accessible.” The rule limits the attachments to a total of 10 pages, “but on application the presiding justice may permit additional pages of attachments for good cause.”
